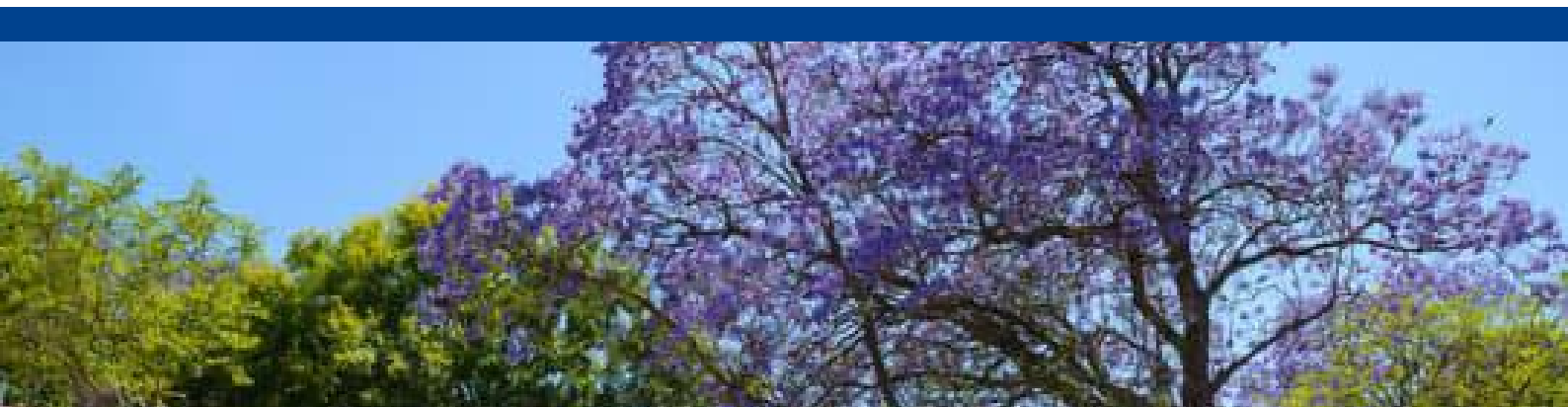

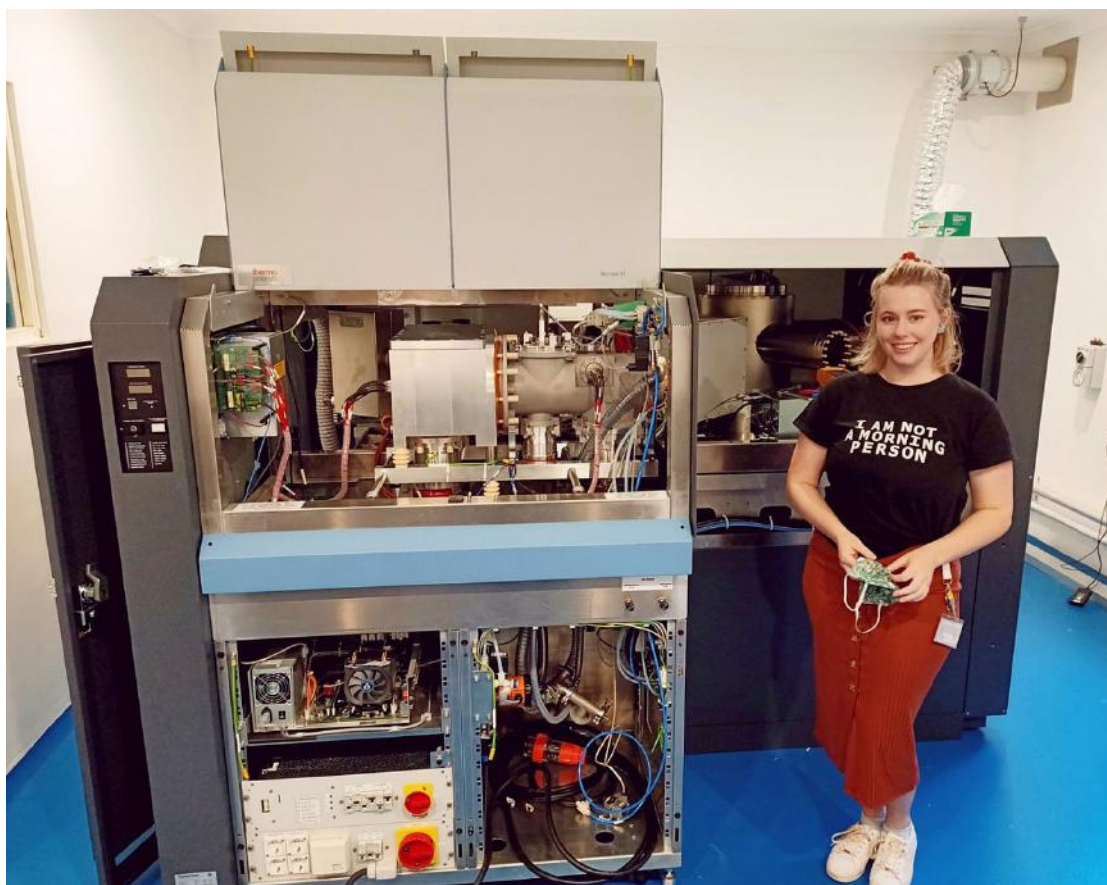

SCIENCE

I was contacted recently by one of our former students Marian Bailey. Marian was hard working student who always struggled with Chemistry. She persisted because she liked the subject, after leaving school life decided to attract her to a profession where

she uses very sophisticated chemistry to do her analysis. The moral of the story is even if you struggle with something keep trying because you never know what curve balls life is going to send your way.



I'm now 6 months into my PhD with the Geoarchaeology and Archaeometry research group, based at Southern Cross uni (in geoscience). I'm currently reconstructing the trophic levels, diet and paleoecological setting of early hominins, hominids and associated fauna in South East Asia (right now I'm mostly working on Gigantopithecus teeth). Lots of isotope analysis happening! We just got a new mass spectrometer, and it's awesome. I've been learning how to set it up with the Thermofisher systems engineer, which has been pretty amazing.

I'm really enjoying it over here! I'm hoping to have my first 'first-author' publication accepted in the next few months so I'll send that over when it's finally out. - Marian

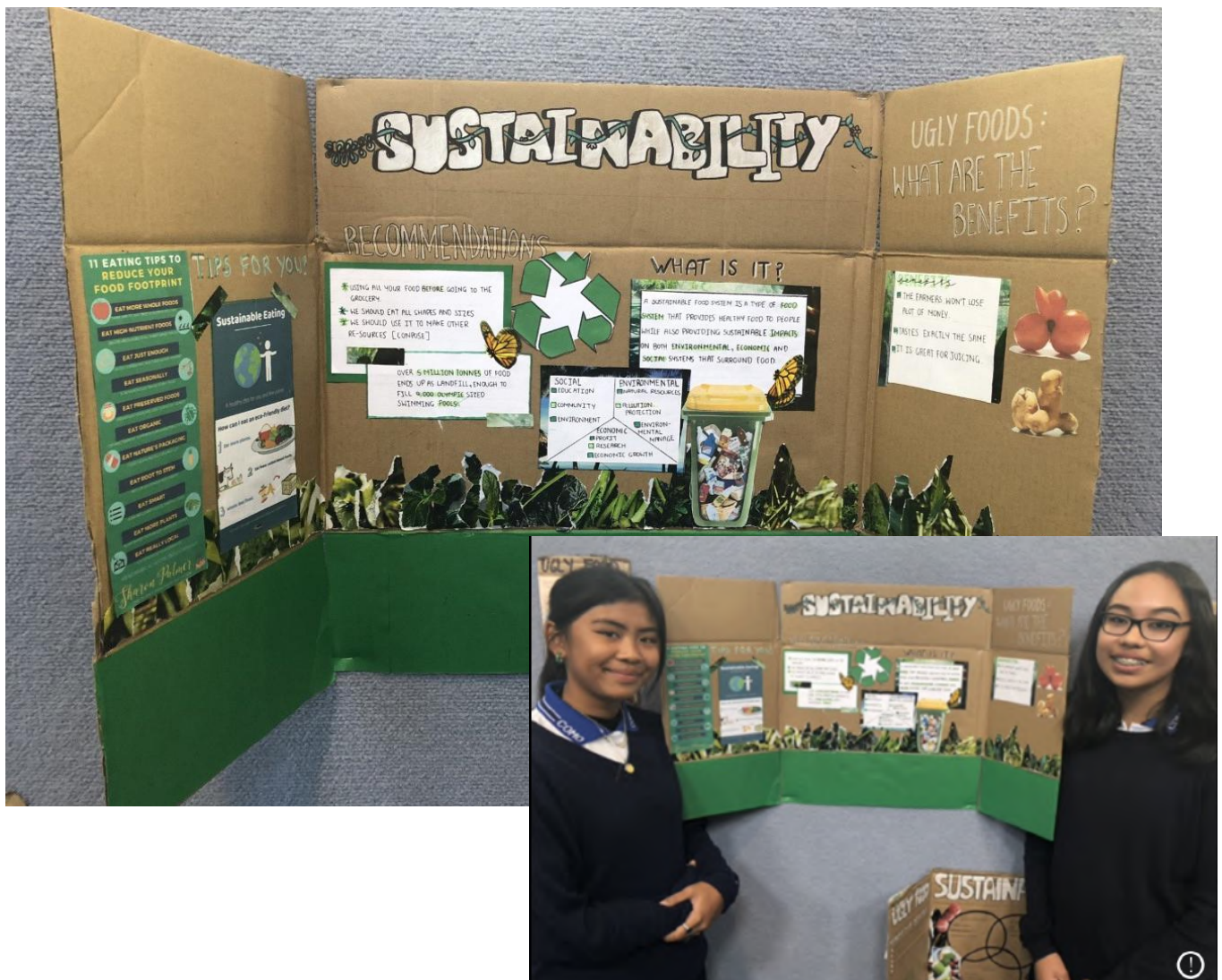

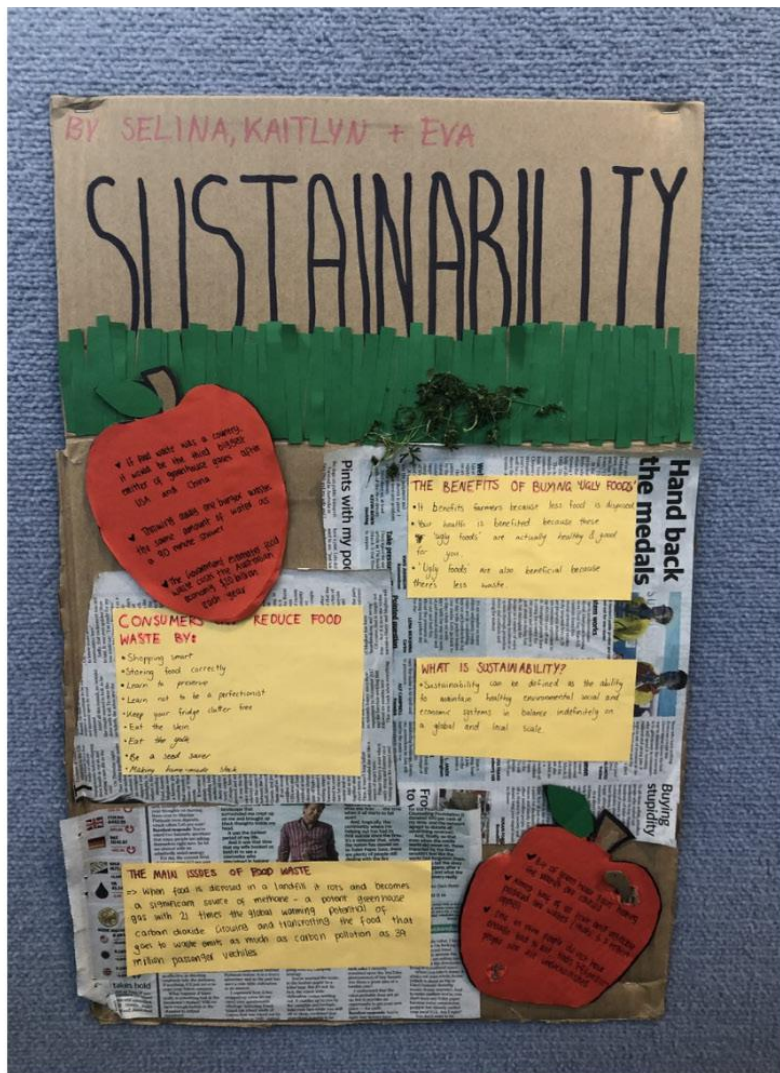
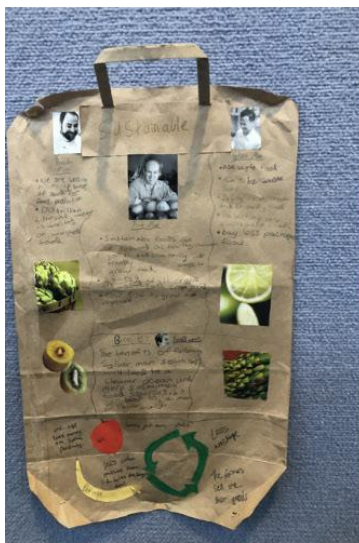
Year 9 Sustainability Poster Project

Ms Preston's year 9 class has been having some fun with the topic sustainability and ugly foods! We were able to create sustainability posters including some interesting insight on ugly foods and why it's okay to buy fruits and vegetables that look a bit odd. Did you know, that Roughly one third of the food produced in the world for human consumption every year which is approximately 1,3 billion tonnes, gets lost or wasted? 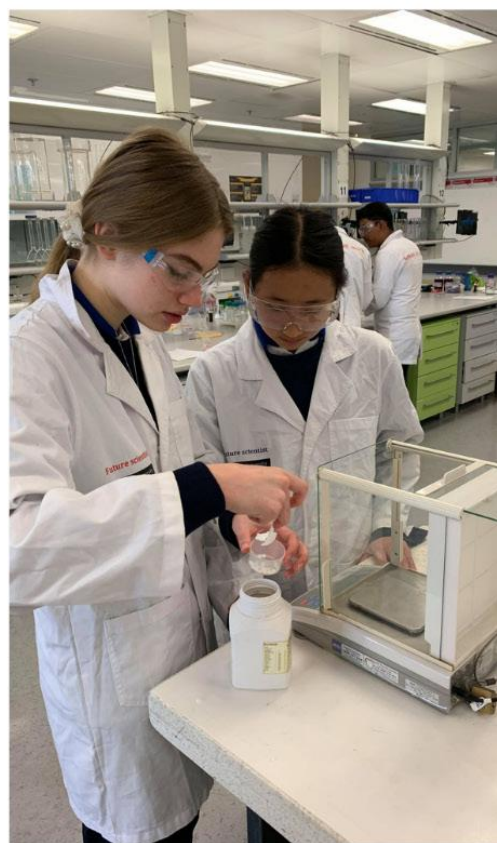
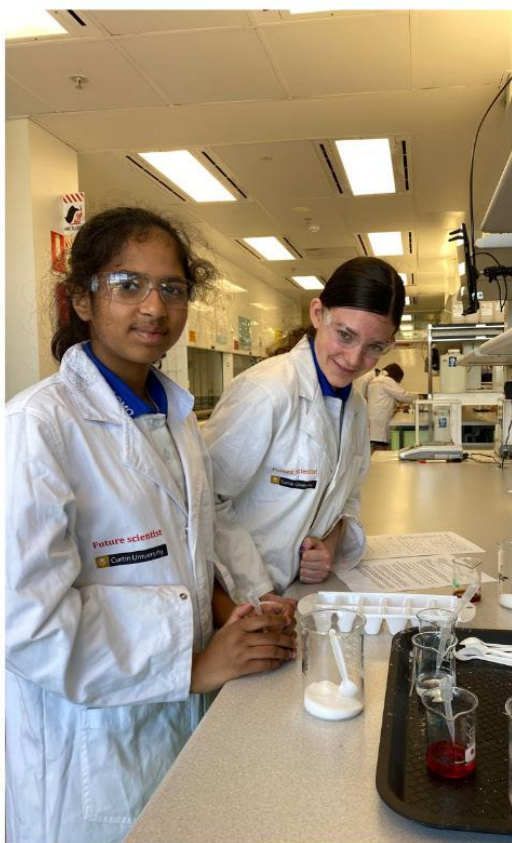

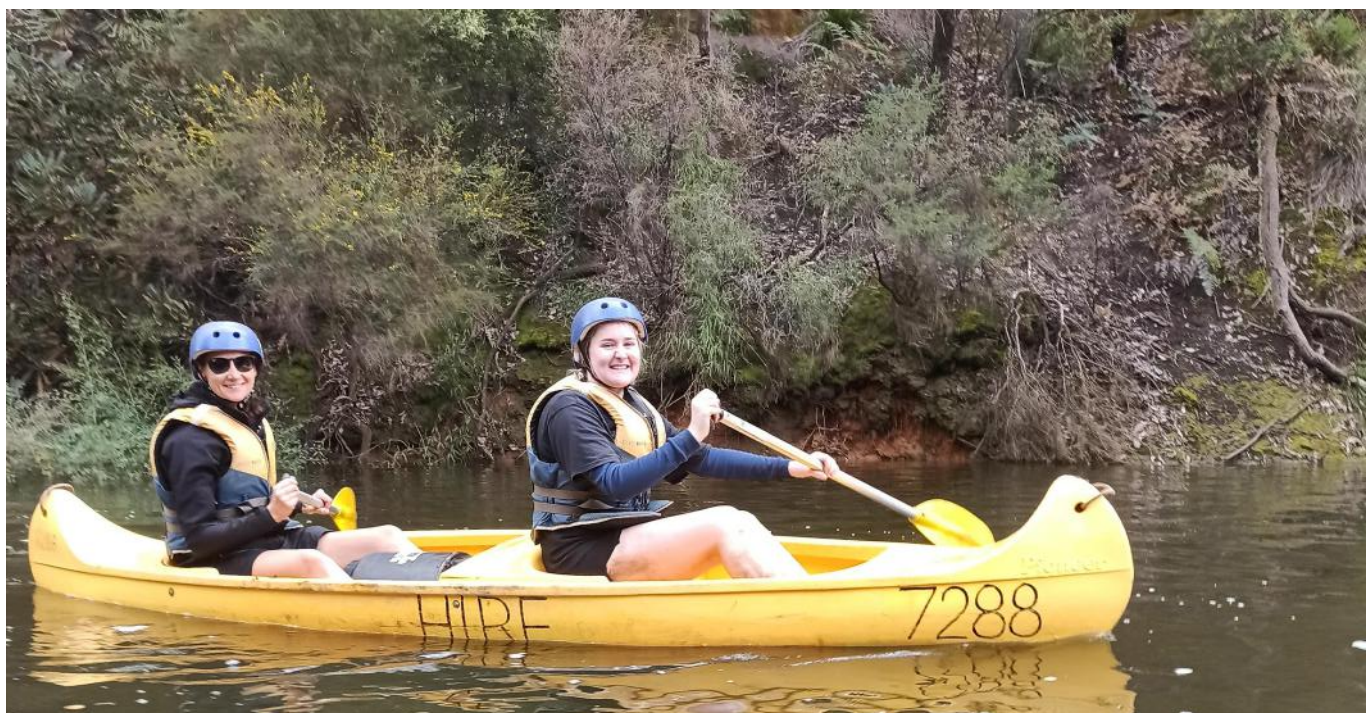

Contact During School Hours

Please DO NOT call the College to ask for a message to be given to your child. Please understand that with a College community of over 800 it is not possible to get messages to individual students. To avoid this issue, please ensure that after school arrangements are pre-arranged. This is part of helping students to become independent.

Drop-off

There is considerable vehicle traffic around our College site before and after school. It is expected that all vehicles use the Bruce Street car park or the marked drop-off bays to drop students off. Staff and Student car parks are NOT to be used for this purpose because it causes a great deal of congestion and potential danger to students.

Health

The Health Centre is open when the School Nurse is on site. When the Centre is open, students may access it at recess and lunch time without needing permission. If a student wishes to go during class time, permission with a note written in the College diary by their supervising teacher is required. If the Nurse is not available, students should see another member of the Student Services team or a Deputy Principal. Under no circumstances are students to contact parents/guardians directly and leave the College grounds without parents contacting the College and the student being properly signed out. In the case of injury, either a parent will be contacted or the student will be sent by ambulance to hospital, at the parent's expense.

NOTE: Please consider the health and wellbeing of others before allowing unwell students to attend school.
