PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE

2021 has been a year that has presented many challenges for students and staff. Significant educational changes in the curriculum have been introduced this year and will continue into next year with Languages being a compulsory subject in Years 7 and 8 in 2022. Another significant change for Como has been a collapse in the international fee-paying student market. This has long been an area of strength for the school and a source of additional income. In the face of these challenges, we as a school have successfully responded by reassessing our priorities and implementing new strategies and structures that will leave us in great shape as we enter 2022.

The Covid pandemic has not gone away and the virus keeps changing so we are making preparations in the event of the school having to close down as per instructions from the Department of Education. Hopefully this will not happen but teachers have been preparing by creating lessons using our new management system, SEQTA.

Changes to Student Services

Mrs Nicole Richardson has been appointed to replace Mr Jarrod Dimanlig as Student Services Manager who is moving to Ocean Reef Senior High School. There was a strong field of applicants for the position however Mrs Richardson vision for the future and strong track record at this school made her the best choice. Mrs Richardson will be able to build on Mr Dimanlig's great work in what was a demanding year.

To ensure that there are always two people available in Student Services the year coordinator positions have been combined into one full-time position with the exception of the Year 12 Coordinator, Mr Josh Findlater, who will continue in the role. From another very strong field of applicants we have appointed another excellent operator who has an excellent track record. An announcement will be made in the new year once the appointment process has been completed.

Keon Bown will be continuing as our Youth Worker. Keon has to come to us with a wealth of experience and has already made good connections with our students. We have increased the time of our Chaplain Robyn Lewis and we have also provided additional administration support.

The emphasis next year will be getting back to the implementation of proactive programs that give our students the skills and information they need to make the right decisions. An exciting initiative for the Health and Physical Education Learning Area will be a focus on mental health and life skills within the lower school health education lessons.

Changes to the School Day and Bus Times

At the request of the school, bus services timed specifically for Como Secondary College that currently depart at 1515 (3:15pm) adjacent to the school grounds will now depart at 1525 (3:25pm) Monday to Friday on school days. School for students on Friday will finish at 1:30. This will provide all students, but particularly upper school students, with an opportunity on Friday afternoon to study at school in the library and then take their usual school bus home.

New Appointments

Science – Ms Jessie Russell has been appointed acting HOLA while Mr Stokes is on leave. Joining the Science team will be Claire Horner, Rhyard Sahely and Sandy Tu. These are experienced teachers who will build upon the solid results achieved in Human Biology and Biology and provide for continuity in Physics and Chemistry.

English – Mx Mitch Fenn has been appointed acting HOLA of English. The school has recruited some very capable and experienced teachers in Clyde Goodenough, Taylah Briggs, Elizabeth Martin and Charles Gabriel and a promising graduate in Jorjiah Horn.

Brody Hart and Alex Borserini will be joining the Arts Learning Area and Jasmine Foster and Genevieve Woods will be joining the Maths team. Haichen Huang will be joining the HASSL team as will Milan Bosich who is moving from Arts to HASSL. Andrew Stephens will be joining the Health and Physical education team

John McKnight will take over from Tate Napier as Teacher-in-Charge of the Hockey Program. Tate is going on long service leave. Penny Coutas will be the new Emits Coordinator. The school has appointed and outstanding Golf teacher to take from Adam Smith. This teacher's name will be announced once the appointment process has been completed.

Staff Farewells

The school farewelled three long-serving retiring staff who have made a great contribution to the school in a variety of ways. Sue Henderson has been at the school for over 30 years and has been a source of wisdom and support for the young teachers coming into the school. Similarly, Gerry Krajewski has been a great support to his fellow staff members and to many students over the years as a year coordinator. Finally, a huge thank you to Greg Stokes who has made the world around him a friendly and amiable place to be.

Mrs Joan Armstrong is leaving to become Deputy Principal at Kojonup District High School. This puts Joan within commuting distance of the family farm and her husband near Narrogin. Candice Crasto is also leaving to be closer to home at HARRISDALE COMMUNITY COLLEGE as is Tyshana who will be teaching at Carine SHS and Emma Cattapan is taking on the challenge of teaching GATE students at Rossmoyne SHS. All three of these teachers have made a great contribution to the school as year coordinators. Also leaving are Annie Demonsthenous who is off to Perth College and Erica Collins who will also be having a much shorter drive to school at Coastal Lakes Community College.

Mrs Christine Emerson is off to Jerramungup to fulfil a long-held wish to teach in the country, Nathan O'Brien will be teaching Music at Butler College. In Science Shaun Middleton will be realising a long-held ambition to teach Marine Science at Ocean Reef SHS. Ellen Sabitino is leaving teaching and hopes to pursue a career in human resources. Ellen did an excellent job this year as the EMITS Coordinator.

The Teacher in Charge of Golf, Adam Smith will be moving much closer to home by taking up the position of Career Adviser at Butler College. Adam has done an excellent job in running the Golf Program and often put in many more hours above and beyond what was required. His brief when he took up the position was to increase enrolments and he leaves having fully achieved this goal.

Staff taking leave next year are Amanda Hammond for the whole year and Tate Napier who will be away for at least Term 1 and probably Term 2.

Finally, thanks to Mr Jarrod Dimanlig who is moving to Ocean Reef to be closer to his family. Jarrod's calm demeanour has been a great asset to the school and he has been someone that our students have been able to turn to when they have needed assistance.

We wish all of these staff well in their new ventures and thank them for their contribution to the school. While I am sad to see them leave I am also excited by the prospect of meeting the teachers who are replacing them. They are a mixture of young teachers and teachers who are in the prime of their careers. All of them are excited to be teaching at Como next year and participating in a strong staff development program.

We wish the Como community a safe and restful break. Enjoy the time with family and friends and we look forward to seeing you in 2022.

Pillay, who were recognised for their on-field performances in the senior finals with the DIBS Medal and Ashleigh Nelson respectively.

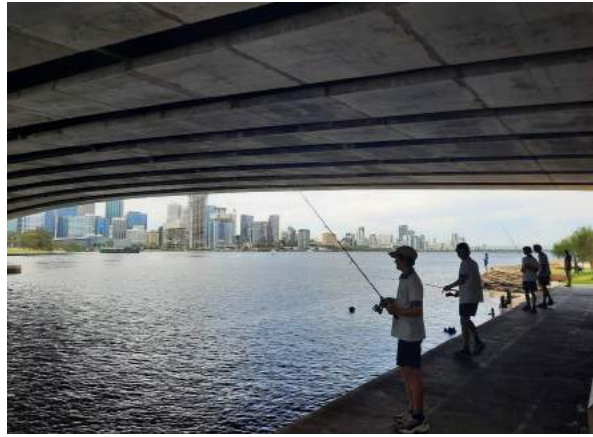

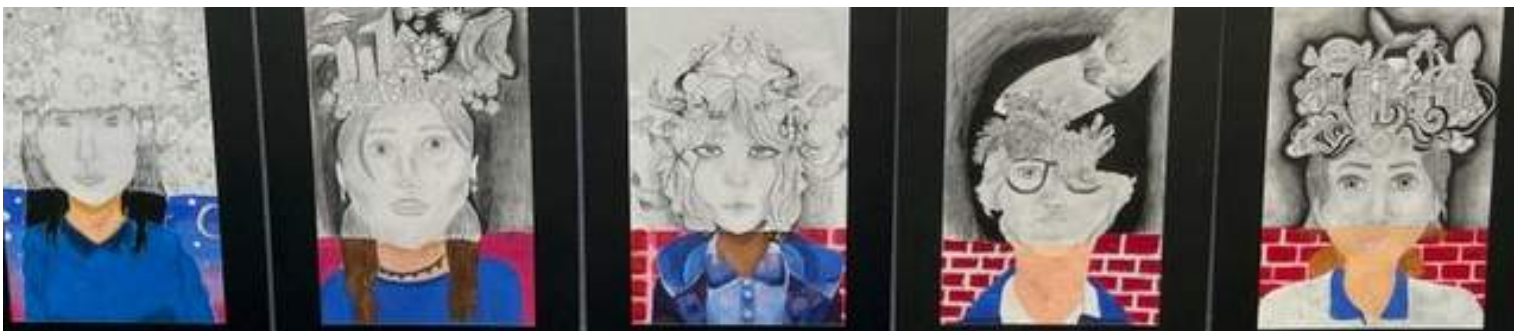

Drop-off

There is considerable vehicle traffic around our College site before and after school. It is expected that all vehicles use the Bruce Street car park or the marked drop-off bays to drop students off. Staff and Student car parks are NOT to be used for this purpose because it causes a great deal of congestion and potential danger to students.

Health

The Health Centre is open when the School Nurse is on site. When the Centre is open, students may access it at recess and lunch time without needing permission. If a student wishes to go during class time, permission with a note written in the College diary by their supervising teacher is required. If the Nurse is not available, students should see another member of the Student Services team or a Deputy Principal. Under no circumstances are students to contact parents/guardians directly and leave the College grounds without parents contacting the College and the student being properly signed out. In the case of injury, either a parent will be contacted or the student will be sent by ambulance to hospital, at the parent's expense.
